

# Kajiado Development Context



RESOURCE AND LANDUSE IN KAJIADO COUNTY



- Area: 21,900 Km<sup>2</sup>
- Administrative Boundaries: 5 administrative sub counties/ Parliamentary Constituencies, 25 County Wards
- Estimated Population: 999,819 in 2016/17 according to KNBS projections 2009.
- Rapid pop and urbanization growth, Est Pop of 1,200,000 in 2022 at annual growth rate of 5% .
- A high poverty rates and low literacy levels exposes a greater % of the pop. to various socio-economic risk factors.
- Largely Livestock and agriculture based economy

# 1. Water, Irrigation, Environment and Natural Resources Ministry:



- i. Revised water access modalities for Noolturesh water pipeline and other water points to ensure Kajiado is given priority and substantial volumes.
- ii. 1 Pipeline and 3 mega dams along the main seasonal rivers in partnership with the national government to connect more households and communities in rural and urban areas to water resources for domestic, livestock, irrigation and industrial use:
- iii. Adequate clean water in all schools and health facilities; connected from the dams, pipeline, boreholes etc
- iv. Establish PPPs to better serve the water needs of our urban centers and maintain the mega dams and pipelines.
- v. Give priority to effective Urban Solid Waste and Sewerage management systems in major towns: Ngong, Kiserian, Rongai, Kitengela, Kajiado, Namanga, Loitokitok etc
- vi. Implement advocacy initiatives calling on citizens to consciously adopt better environmental management practices.
- vii. Incentivize investment in light and heavy industries adding value to our key natural resources: marble, limestone, ballast, gypsum, cement among other natural resources.

# 1(b). Water, Irrigation, Environment and Natural Resources Ministry:



- viii. Analyze potential investment opportunities in all sectors in the county and prepare an investment blue print for use in marketing the county to potential PPP investment partners.
- ix. Provide investment incentives that encourage best value towards job and wealth creation and critical infrastructure
- x. Review/ develop county laws and policies to ensure effective and responsible extraction and value addition of the rich mineral resources found in Kajiado.
- xi. In partnership with other stakeholders, review/develop progressive oil and gas, natural resources laws and policies at national and county level that protect the interests and aspirations of the people of Kajiado in terms of negotiated royalties, community trust funds, share of job portfolios and service tenders.
- xii. Create a *natural resources research and development trust fund* to be funded from oil and gas, wind, solar and geothermal energy production royalties and ensure continued research on exploration on other potential minerals in the county and financing priority community development programs in the host communities
- xiii. Work closely with the national government, host communities and new potential investors to responsibly exploit these resources and to expand and scale up production in the coming years.



## 2. Medical Services, Public Health and Sanitation Ministry:

- i. Teaching & Referral Hospital Level 5 Completed and launched
- ii. 4 sub-county Hospitals refurbished and equipped to standard
- iii. 1 new sub-county Hospital established in Kajiado West sub county
- iv. Strengthened human resources for health management and development,
- v. Strengthened preventive care at community health services (Level 1); Integrated school and community health programmes. support routine mobile/nomadic clinics to remote villages.
- vi. Increased adoption of healthy lifestyle through stronger outreach and health education programs,
- vii. upgraded and strengthened ambulatory and referral system across the county

### 3. Youth, Sports, Gender and Social Services Ministry:



- i. *Model community development centers* with youth entrepreneurship incubation, recreation, sports and talent development, prevention of substance abuse facilities.
- ii. One football and one Athletics Stadiums established in the county
- iii. Capacity building and seed grants for Youth and Women Cooperative societies and associations
- iv. Linkages to public and private financing and markets for their products and services.

# 4. Roads, Public Works, Housing and Energy Ministry



- i. Revised county public works and housing policy/guidelines
- ii. Urban by-Passes completed in urban areas aimed at reducing congestion and rush hour jams in collaboration with the NG; Kitengela-Rongai, Rongai- Bulbul, Kajiado, Namanga, Loitokitok, Isinya, Ewaso urban access roads etc
- iii. Reduced transportation costs and improved access to agricultural and livestock markets, schools and important public facilities: increased number of county access roads that are graveled to top quality standards: 1000 kms with at least 250km tarmacked
- iv. Expanded and Improved public infrastructure : New County HQ Complex, completion of stalled priority Health Facilities and Education facilities
- v. Support investments in green energy including: Wind Power generation, Solar Power generation, Geothermal Power generation
- vi. Support investments in Oil and Gas:
- vii. encourage investment in cluster settlements/real estate development in designated zones.
- viii. Increased number of households connected to the national electricity grid



## 5. Land, Physical and Urban Planning Ministry:

- i. Update, Strengthen and implement **land use zoning policy**: Residential, Industrial, Agricultural, Pastoralism, Conservation & Tourism, Roads, Forests, Lake and river basins etc
- ii. **Review/ update existing county spatial plans** followed by digital mapping and coding of all land records
- iii. Strengthen and make **efficient land administration** as provided for in law: land control boards include CG representatives, land use approvals,
- iv. Automation of land property management and tax administration systems and root out corrupt land dealings.

# 6. Agriculture, Livestock, Fisheries and Co-operatives Development Ministry:



- i. **The Hay Production Program:** Model and encourage investments in Hay production and fodder conservation to ensure pasture availability during the dry seasons
- ii. Develop and strengthen Livestock value chains: encourage investments in modern abattoirs and processing of, dairy, beef, goat, mutton, hides & skins, bones & hoofs
- iii. Develop and strengthen cash crops value chains : tomatoes, onions, maize, horticulture,
- iv. Support CBOs, to transform into economic development associations, cooperatives, companies with focus on Youth and Women cooperatives that focus on the livestock and cash crop value chains
- v. link the livestock subsector to the water subsector to ensure effective access to water resource needs.
- vi. Revamped livestock extension services ;to provide supportive technical services/capacity building to pastoralists and dairy farmers, scale up subsidize veterinary products and services and drip irrigation and greenhouses



## 6 (b) Agriculture, Livestock, Fisheries and Co-operatives Development Ministry:

- vii. Support investments in establishment of a county drought early warning system (DEWS) towards improved management of climate impacts.
- viii. PPPs for the creation of high value export markets for our fresh produce and processed products.
- ix. Developed a smart agriculture and agri-business Policy, provide incentives for commercial cash crop production and scaling up of small into medium and large agribusinesses in designated zones.
- x. In collaboration with the water sector, support irrigation fed agriculture to ensure all year round food production.
- xi. Support investments that promote conservation of perishable /non-perishable produce: such as milk, tomatoes, maize etc
- xii. Invest in the development of fresh produce markets in major towns.



## 7. Trade, Culture, Tourism and Wildlife Ministry:

- i. Database of all SMEs profiles digitized and registered with the Trade Department, County chamber of commerce and with the county digital tax revenue system
- ii. Maa History and Cultural Museum operationalized at the County HQ complex
- iii. Recreational Park opened at County HQ complex
- iv. County has representatives in the Tourism Levy Fund and KWS boards
- v. County Conservation Trust fund Established– supporting reduction of human/wildlife conflict management, speedy compensations
- vi. Strengthened Community Conservancies in designated areas
- vii. Ushanga Program profitably supporting women associations, cooperatives across the county



## 8. Education and Vocational Training Ministry:

- i. A [Kajiado Public Technical University](#) that shall offer practical/technical courses/skills that meet our current and future unique socio-economic development needs.
- ii. Improved quality of education and performance of ECD schools
- iii. Scaled up of the *School Shamba* Food Security project
- iv. Improved quality of education and transition rates at all levels in line with the national transition rates targets in partnership with the ministry of education, SMCs, PTAs
- v. 2000 Youth drawn from across the county supported through the *2Jiajiri* Program in partnership with KCB Foundation: Vocational training scholarships, startups support and soft loans.
- vi. Providing structured and robust bursaries to the most deserving pupils and students from poor families.

# 9. County Treasury and Economic Planning:



- i. **Automated Revenue-Stream based system established as a matter of priority**, targeting expanded local revenue by at least 50% over the midterm, close possible leakages and wastage loopholes through; mapping, listing and automation of all related processes.
- ii. Citizens' development priorities structured and aligning to economic development pillars and land use zones and national flagship projects.
- iii. Priority budgets for key county flagship projects with potential for highest economic dividends
- iv. Expanded Development budget to at least 45% of total revenue and increased absorption rate with focus on sectors with the greatest dividend to Kajiado citizens including: water, roads, healthcare, agriculture/livestock, trade/industry and natural resources sectors.
- v. Improved efficiency in procurement; sub-units to deal with details and main department to deal with global aspects of procurements.
- vi. Macroeconomic stability ensured by implementing a robust legal framework, enhanced accounting and financial management systems to support budgeting, expenditure and accountability pressures.



## 10. Public Service, Administration & Citizen Participation:

- i. Review governance, management and service delivery structures in all departments to ensure full accountability and transparency with focus on service to the people of Kajiado County with no favor or discrimination.
- ii. An effective performance management systems and processes used to appraise performance on a semi-annual basis. individual staff performance contracts shall contribute to unit, facility, division and departmental score cards.
- iii. The quality of staff must be above board and an important part of achieving this plan.
- iv. increased allocation of resources to update staff knowledge and skills to acceptable professional standards and ensure requisite efficiency and effectiveness.
- v. Digitize all government operations to modernize and improve on overall governance and service delivery and ensure efficient access to all government services e.g. parking, land rates, rents, and license applications and various fee payments.
- vi. Review citizen participation policy, systems and guidelines and put budgets in place so that citizens can effectively participate in the determination of priority development programs that positively affect them

# 10 (b): Public Service, Administration & Citizen Participation



- i. Effective Citizen participation structures at the village, ward, sub-county and county levels.
- ii. Steer unity and integration towards elimination of feelings of discrimination on account of tribe, clan, gender, religion etc.
- iii. Citizens involved in analyzing development problems, prioritizing development programs, budgeting, implementation and evaluation of implemented projects to foster transparency, accountability and learning and promote sustainability.
- iv. effective participation in intergovernmental forums, constitutional bodies and agencies to harmonize county and national development programs and ensure optimum benefit from development partnerships.
- v. ensure our county is free of criminal elements and promote peaceful community integration and co-existence for accelerated socio-economic Development.
